United States Conference of Catholic Bishops

EPISCOPAL LIAISON

The NRVC is grateful for Archbishop Charles C. Thompson who is the episcopal liaison to the National Religious Vocation Conference at the appointment of Bishop James Checchio, Chairman of the USCCB Committee on Clergy, Consecrated Life, and Vocations (CCLV).

USCCB SECRETARIAT OF CLERGY, CONSECRATED LIFE, AND VOCATIONS

The NRVC attended the annual meeting virtually on November 3, 2021, represented by Sr. Deborah Borneman, SS.C.M. The agenda addressed the effects of the pandemic on various organizations through the lens of evangelization.

USCCB, SECRETARIAT OF LAITY, YOUTH, AND YOUNG ADULT MINISTRY

The NRVC was invited to a listening session on August 31, 2021, by the USCCB, Secretariat of Laity, Youth, and Young Adult Ministry, focused on the draft of the Bishops Working Group in their development of the *National Pastoral Framework on Youth and Young Adults*. This document will integrate the major themes of *Christus Vivit*, Convocation of Catholic Leaders, XV Synod, V Encuentro, National Dialogue, and Journeying Together. Sr. Deborah Borneman, SS.C.M. represented the NRVC.

National Dialogue on Catholic Pastoral Ministry with Youth and Young Adults

The NRVC was involved in a three-year process contributing to the National Dialogue and the final report was released on February 22, 2021. This report reaffirmed the need for broad vocation guidance and shed light on the complex reality of what young people are experiencing and asking of the Church. It is estimated that almost 10,000 individuals were reached in about 450 recorded National Dialogue conversations.

Ministry Training Source Research

The NRVC and other national organizations are partnering with Ministry Training Source in a National Research Study on Catholic Youth and Young Adult Ministry Leaders in the United States. This research aims to prepare the Church for the emerging generation of ministry leaders who are considered a part of Gen Z. Ministry Training Source has studied longitudinally the fields of Catholic youth and young adult ministry leaders since 2001. The primary researcher is Ms. Charlotte McCorquodale, PhD, who presented at the 2019 Fall Institute.

NFCRV update

In 2021 NRVC members were awarded \$42,750 in educational debt relief through the National Fund for Catholic Religious Vocations for two candidates to



religious life. These funds enabled the candidates to discern their call free from the worry of student loan payments. The NFCRV is grateful to the Helen Brach Foundation and the National Council of Catholic Women for their continued support of our mission.

Since its inception, the NFCRV has granted \$980,317 toward the educational debt of more than 49 candidates to religious life. All of this is done as a benefit of NRVC membership and through the generosity of our supporters and benefactors. The grant application period runs from January to April each year. Letter from the Finance Director



INVESTMENTS under management with Christian Brothers Investment Services at 12/31/2021 were \$1,971,384, a significant increase over the 12/31/2020 balance of \$1,334,933. The NRVC moved funds from local savings to participate in a strong market, while maintaining sufficient cash flow for grant projects and operations. Cash held in local accounts at 12/31/2021 totaled \$349,829.

Generous grants from GHR Foundation and Conrad N. Hilton Foundation supported many special opportunities and projects the NRVC was able to accomplish in 2021, and continues to manage in 2022. Thanks to a grant from GHR Foundation, our Religious Life Storymap is available, and is constantly being added to; and the NRVC produced the first two of six webinars in the video series Learn It! Love It! Live It! These join our Abundant Hope videos online for everyone with a heart for vocation ministry to appreciate. Many spectacular leadership formation opportunities were realized with the Hilton grant, as well as Diversity, Equity and Inclusion evaluation for our National Board and leadership team. We are richly blessed by these organizations' faith in the NRVC to partner with them to achieve significant goals. Donations to the Misericordia Fund were very generous in 2021, and many members were able to participate in formation opportunities thanks to the goodness

of fellow NRVC members. When designated by donors for Misericordia scholarships, these funds are restricted.

Membership dues and income from workshops and programs continue to be the strongest source of revenue for the NRVC, providing 68% of 2021 operating revenue. Publications and resources contributed 6%, general contributions along with operating revenue from grants provided 23%, and in-kind donations, honoraria, and miscellaneous revenue combined provided 3%. Investment returns represent 26% of total public support, revenues, and transfers in 2021.

The 2021 and 2020 Financial Reviews were performed by Sikich LLP, certified public accountants and advisors. For both years, Sikich issued a conclusion that they are not aware of any material modifications that should be made to the NRVC's financial statements for them to be in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Finally, the NRVC closed 2021 with total net assets of \$1,923,776, an increase of \$327,221 over 2020.
